Basically we specialize in self publishing. With self publishing you are responsible for the authoring, editing and the marketing of your book, we look after the printing, binding and supplying any ISBN numbers etc. With self publishing we only charge for the printing of your books, when you sell them you keep all the profits from your books and you own all the rights to your books.

Conventional book publishers will charge you an up front fee which will cover their costs to print the books and something towards them marketing your book. They will get you to sign a contract that says they own the publication rights to your book which means you can't go to another publisher until that contract runs out. You will not make any money from the book until they have sold maybe 200 or 300 books, so , as you can see, your book has to be a good seller before you will make money from it. Also, of course, they may not be interested in your book at all, which is a big problem, especially for first time authors.

With self publishing, once you have paid for the printing of the books, everything else you keep, but you are responsible for selling them. If you are confident in being able to sell your books then self publishing is definitely the best option.

So far as the price is concerned we obviously need to know exactly how many pages are in your book and several other factors, such as what type of binding you want, to be able to give you a quote to make the books.
